Section 14 - Transportation Information

- 2. Battery, according to Section IB of PACKING INSTRUCTION 968 of the 2022 IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations 63rd Edition, may be transported/applicable to U.S D.O.T regulations for the safe transport of Lithium Battery.
- 3. Battery to be protected to prevent short circuit. This includes protection against contact with conductive materials within the same packaging that could lead to short circuit
- 4. Cells and batteries, offered for transport, must be packed in inner packaging that completely enclose the cell or battery; To provide protection form damage or compression of the batteries, the inner packaging must be placed in a strong rigid outer

- 5. The packaging shall be adequate to avoid mechanical damage during transport, handling, and stacking & Stock on shelves. The material and pack design shall be chosen to prevent the development of unintentional electrical conduction, corrosion of the terminals and ingress of moisture.
